Hispanic/Latinx Health Assessment Survey

In conjunction with the Spokane Regional Health District, HBPA has applied for and received a \$7,000 grant from Empire Health Services to conduct a survey/study of the health needs of the Hispanic/Latinx community in Spokane and Adams Counties. Once they learned of the grant, Providence Health Care quickly joined in and contributed an additional \$3,000 to conduct this survey. The parameters of the survey are being developed and the community will soon be approached to answer survey questions which will be used to develop additional resources for addressing local health needs in our Hispanic/Latinx community.
